

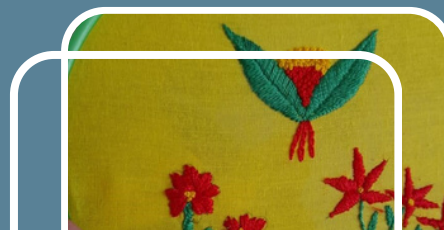
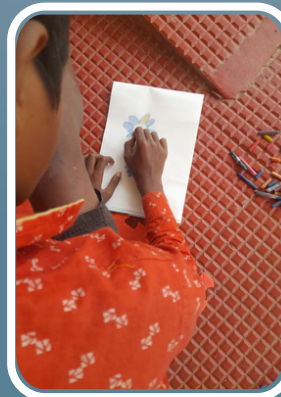

## *Message from Chairman and Managing Director*



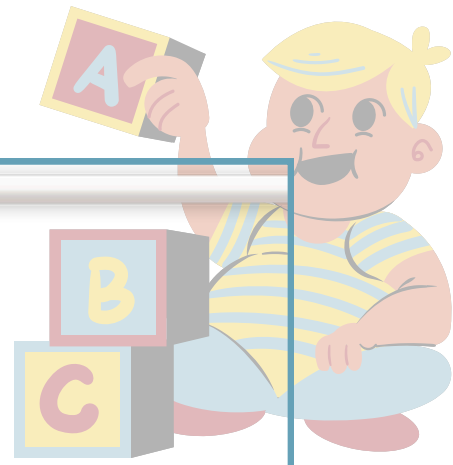

FISS pledges to work closely for the attainment of sustainable development goals and to address the region's most pressing issues. FISS keep the respective attention and effort actively focused on the achievement of 5 centres of FISS such as; a) Centre for Economic Development, b) Centre for Social Development, c) Centre for Environment Action, d) Centre for CSR & partnership, and e) Centre for Infrastructure Development.

The Centre for Social Development (CSD) deals with the multiple social dimensions which can bring about equity, justice, peace, and well-being in a fast changing Society. Children with disabilities are the most vulnerable group and need special attention. The special children refer to those individuals who require assistance for disabilities that may be medical, mental or psychological. Special children include autism, asperge syndrome, cerebral palsy, dyslexia, dysgraphia, blindness, deafness, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), cystic fibrosis, etc. A special needs child may require alternative approaches to education that not only accommodate their conditions but also work toward creating ways for them to further their own capacity to learn and develop.

To address the problems and challenges of these children or special group, Foundation for Integrated Support and Solution (FISS), has started the Special Home at Tinsukia District for development of physical, mental, emotional, and psychological health of these needy children. FISS has registered under Section 41 (1) of The Juvenile Justice (Care & Protection of Children) Act, 2015 for a period of five (5) years and in this regard, FISS has inaugurated Navarupantar Home for Special Need Children in Doomdooma, P.O- Rupaisiding, Dist- Tinsukia, Assam, 786153 on 6th December 2022.





## Welcome to Navarupantar Home

The Navarupantar Home for Special Need Children inaugurated on December 6, 2022. It provides shelter for underprivileged, orphaned, and semi-orphaned children ages 6-18 years. With a total capacity of 25, it initially started with 4 children and now provides shelter to 12 children till date. Navarupantar meets the children's needs for food, clothing, education, medical care, and support.



The home is located at Rupaisiding, Kako Road, Doomdooma, Tinsukia district of Assam. The place is approximately 500 km from the state capital and 30 km from Tinsukia township, the district headquarter. With utmost care and empathy, it provides physical, moral, and psychological assistance to children with disabilities to help them join mainstream society. Operating under the Juvenile Justice Act, children are referred by the Child Welfare Committee (CWCs), Tinsukia. Navarupantar aims to be a safe, nurturing home where these vulnerable youths can thrive.

Our children have limitations that they were born with but they ability rather than disability. They've been further traumatized through rejection and separation from their parents. Our focus is on nurturing and loving them back into wholeness, as best as we can. Whether it be providing an ice-cream or taking them out to a movie, we want them to enjoy life just as other children do! Even though physiotherapy and early sensory training are extremely critical for their development, we never underestimate the role of socializing, which contributes to their psychological and mental wellbeing too. So, we take them out regularly to places of worship, the beach, public parks, and places where they get to meet other children and adults. Under supervision, they are encouraged to play daily at the local playground.

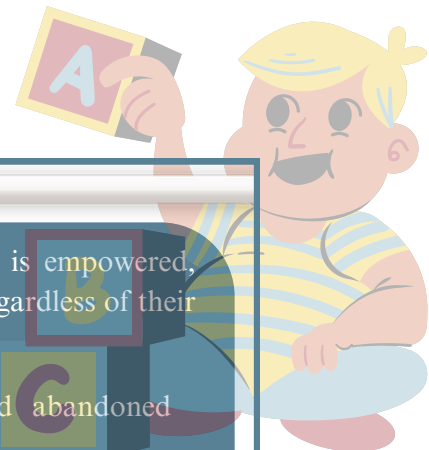


Not only is this healthy for their bodies, encouraging them to better mobility, but the social interaction helps them adjust and carry themselves with confidence in public, while the public learn to accept and interact with them.

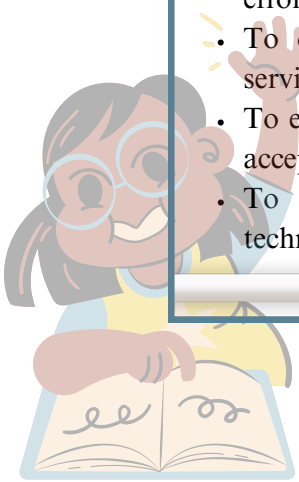
- To reach out to differently abled orphan and abandoned children, who are in need of care and protection.

- To equip the community to integrate such children into society.

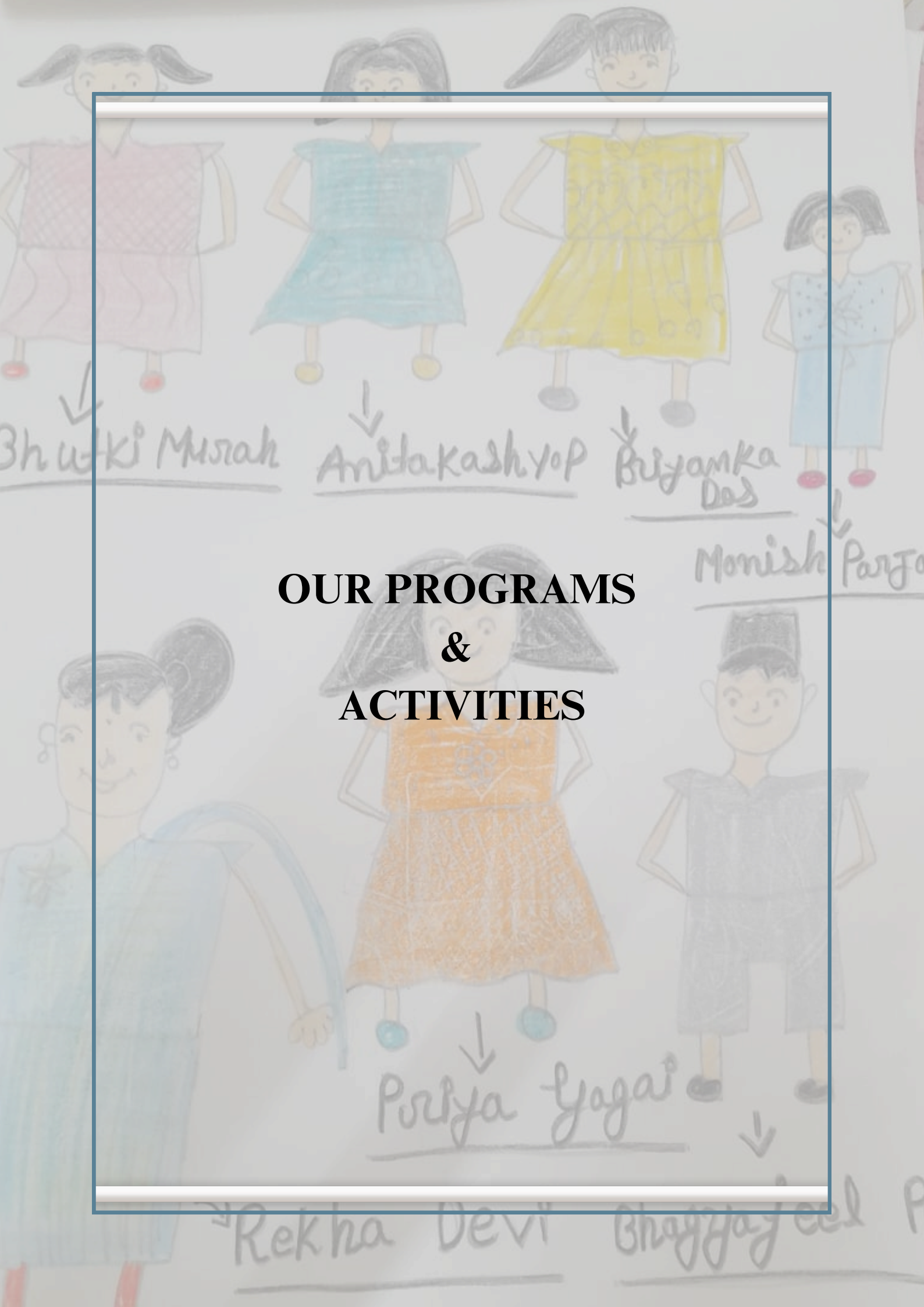
#### OUR VALUES

### Aims and objectives of Navarupantar Home

- To identify children with disabilities in the community through outreach programs, partnerships with schools and healthcare providers. Develop assessments and support plans tailored to each child's unique needs and abilities.
- To provide inclusive educational opportunities for children with disabilities, from early intervention services to primary, secondary and vocational training. Ensure schools are equipped with trained staff, accessible facilities and individualized academic plans.
- To offer vocational training programs that provide children with disabilities the skills necessary to gain meaningful employment. Partner with businesses to place trainees into jobs suited to their strengths.
- To construct and maintain accessible residential facilities to house children with severe disabilities who require round-the-clock care. Staff residences with trained personnel and therapists to assist with medical, mobility and behavioral needs.
- To promote the integration of children with disabilities into mainstream classrooms, recreational activities and community events. Work to end stigma and educate the public on embracing inclusiveness.
- To raise funds through outreach to public and private organizations for donations and grants. Allocate funding towards specialized equipment, therapies, staff training and other support services.
- To strive to improve quality of life for children with disabilities through early intervention, education, enrichment activities, job training, health services and community inclusion.
- To partner with government agencies, NGOs, healthcare providers, vocational rehab organizations and other stakeholders to develop collaborative programs and coordinate efforts.
- To offer financial assistance, academic scholarships, medical care and other targeted services to underprivileged children with disabilities based on individual needs.
- To educate all children on the rights and responsibilities of those with disabilities to foster acceptance and empowerment.
- To provide workshops on life skills, vocational skills and utilization of assistive technologies. Ensure children with disabilities can live as independently as possible.

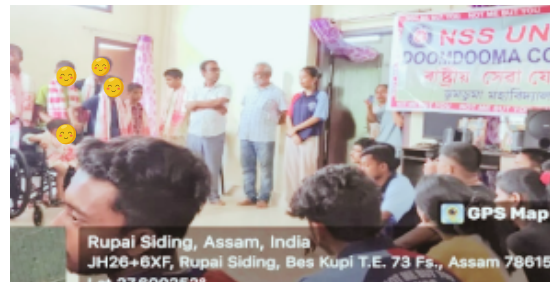
### • Independence Day

### • National Human Rights Day

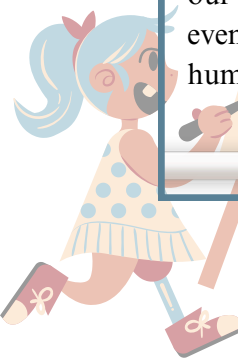

• **Veer Baal Diwas**

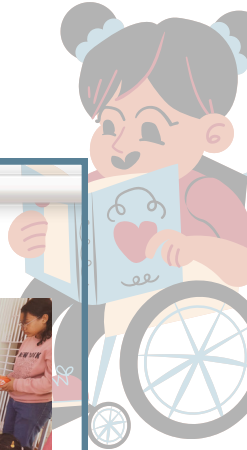

• **Bamboo Craft Training**



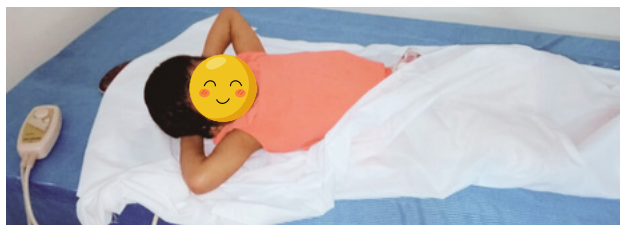

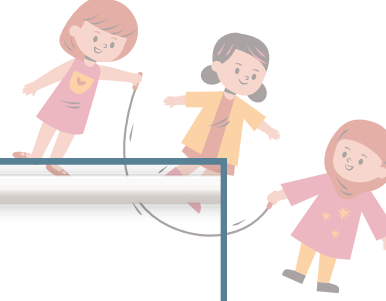
### **Challenges:**

- Investing in technology and resources to enhance learning experiences and accessibility.

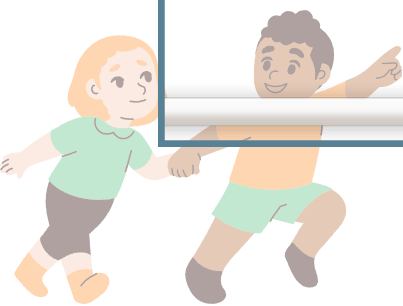


